- 7:40 Load @ MAC (freezable/bulky items in luggage area under bus, small bag as carry on)
- 8:00am Depart MAC for Manitou
- 8:30 Load @ Manitou
- 8:40 Depart Manitou for Austin
- 9:40 Load @ Austin
- 9:45 Depart Austin
- 10:40 Pit stop in Brandon ( Tim's Hwy 1)
- 12:00 Lunch in Moosomin (A&W, Subway & KFC all within 2 block radius)
- 2:30 Pit Stop in Regina (Husky/ McDonalds)
- 3:45 Arrive at Briercrest - Register / unload, Let the party begin!
- Returning late Sunday evening
